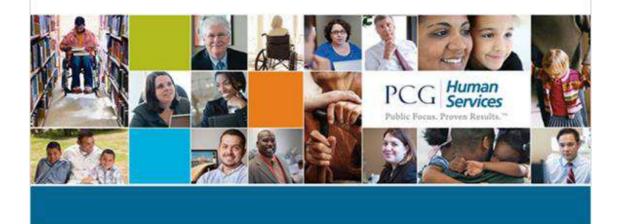

### 2 Introduction



Recent changes have seen the implementation of voided claims from the El Billing System.

These claims initially paid to Medicaid and from Escrow, for varying reasons, do not qualify as eligible disbursements.

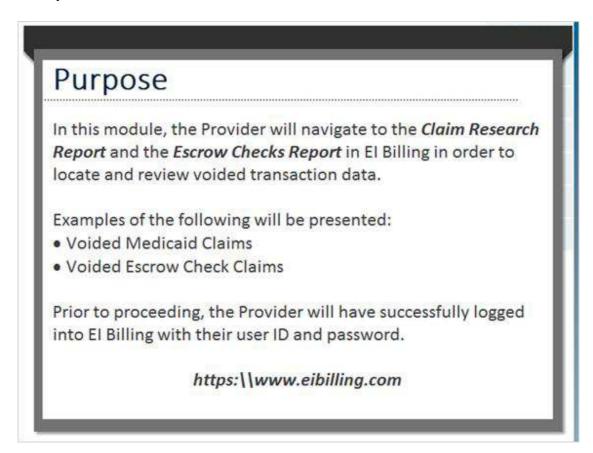
As a result, these funds which were previously disbursed will require re-payment to New York State.

This documentation was created to show Providers where to obtain data regarding Voided claims.

Hint: For quicker navigation, click on the 'Menu' link on the top right-hand side of the player to move freely among the sections of this document.

### 3 Purpose



#### Notes:

Claims will first appear in the *Claim Research Report* when the voided claims are posted. Once the voided claims are received and confirmed, additional information will be viewable via the *Escrow Checks Report*.

In either event, the navigation will be displayed in order to view each report, and will also show how to reach the 'Billing History' screen from both reports.

### 4 Claim Research Report Navigation



### Notes:

Left-click on the Reports tab to open the menu.

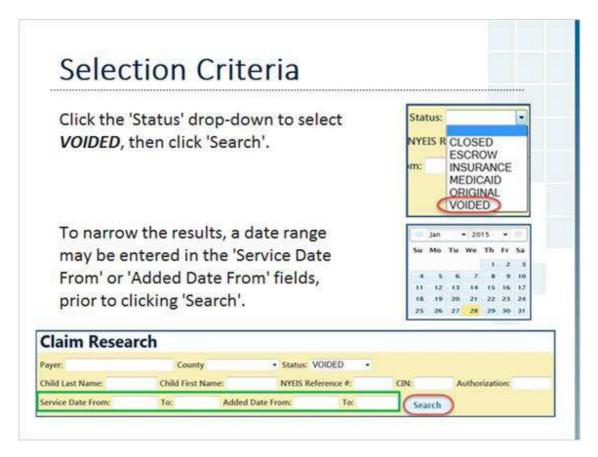
Move the cursor down to Claiming, then move the cursor over to Claim Research, and left-click.

These navigation steps can be accessed from any screen where the tabs are present.

Hint #1: Hold down the <CTRL> key before left clicking to open in another web browser tab.

Hint #2: Hold down the <SHIFT> key before left clicking to open in another web browser window.

### 5 Selection Criteria



### Notes:

PCG recommends utilizing the 'Service Date' or the 'Added Date' fields.

Searching without including date parameters may lead to either an excessive number of results, or cause the report to 'Time Out'; meaning there were too many results to retrieve and display.

The date may be either entered in via keyboard, or via the pop-up calendar.

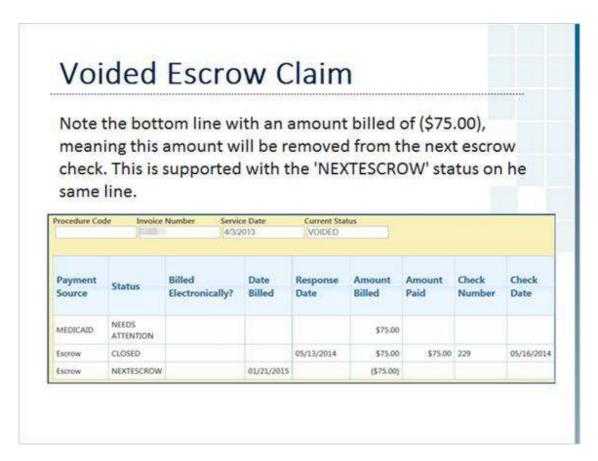

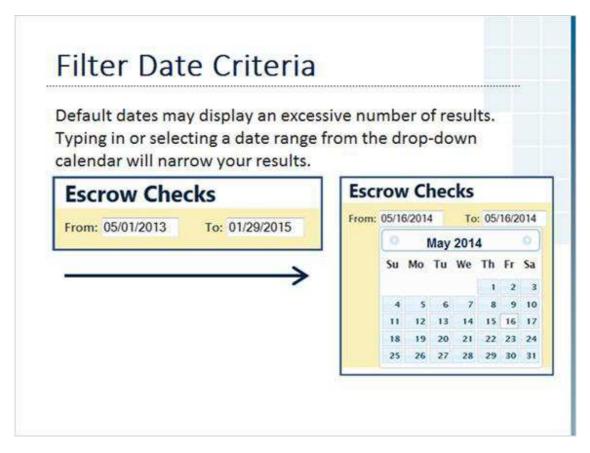
Move the cursor down to Financial, then move the cursor over to Escrow Checks, and left-click.

### 13 Filter Date Criteria

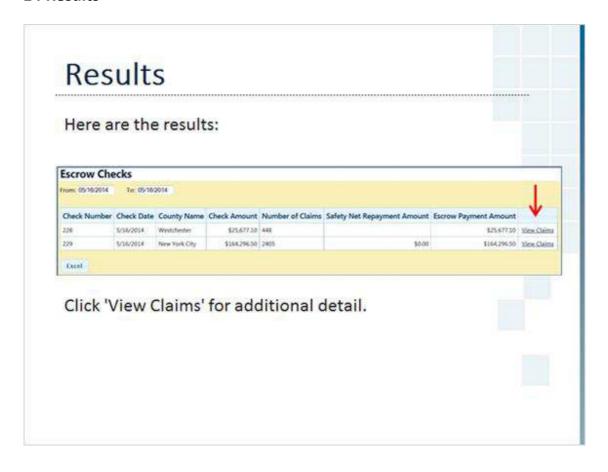


### **Notes:**

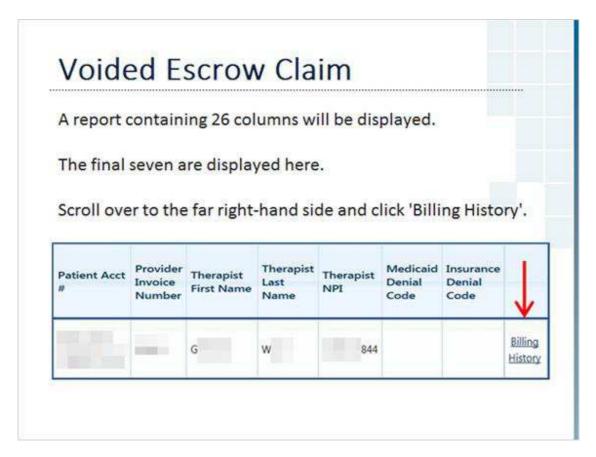
Select a date range that will return a manageable number of results.

The results update instantly - there is no need to click another button such as a 'Search' or 'Refresh' button.

Hint: All columns can be sorted in alphabetical or numerical order (reverse order, too)

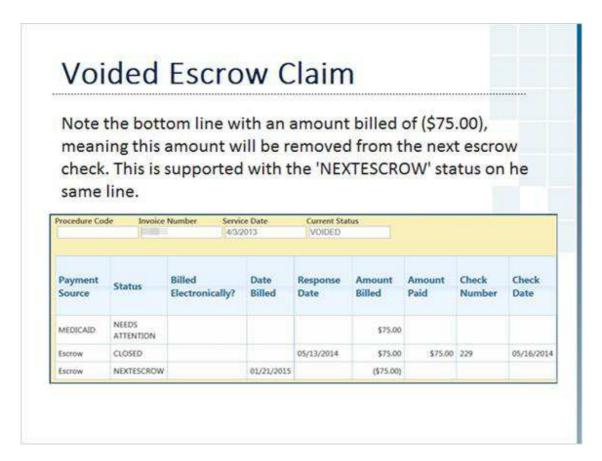

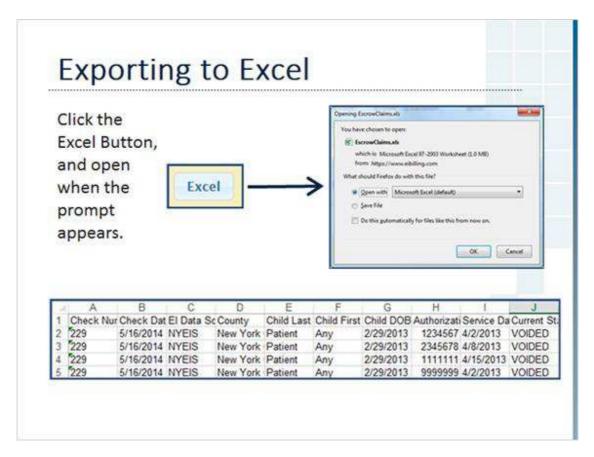
### 20 Updated Medicaid Claim

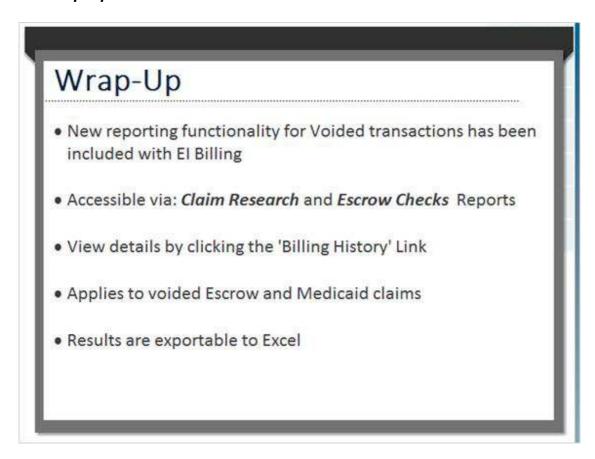
### 21 Exporting to Excel
